The game itself is very simple, a short series of 'click/tap to complete' actions with very basic animation and a single set of three division problems using scientific notation being the sole puzzle. Sat here as an adult it reminded me of the kind of touch screen display sections I remember seeing in the childrens galleries at science museums and was a twenty minute curiosity at best.

If you've a child of the right age with a bit of a 'wow!' about space then this might be a suitable quick distraction (though I think they'd get on better with the ipad version). If you're an adult who wants to play with rovers on Mars, I'd reccomend 'Take On Mars' from the early access section.

And if you're looking for more fun with text to speech? Wait for the future online release as there is nothing here to sate your JOHN MADDEN JOHN MADDEN AEIOU related needs:).
